activities with us. It was **amazing** to hear his story and the children were absolutely **wonderful** and engaged throughout. They are so caring and considerate and this really showed throughout this session.


It does seem unbelievable that we are already talking about Christmas, as once again this year seems to have flown by.

Parents Consultation Evening: 18th November 2021 We very much hope this will be face-to-face, unless we are instructed by Public Health to make it a telephone event, if the number of cases of Covid-19 in our local area has risen to such an extent.

Therefore, to try and reduce the risk of Covid-19 entering the school and in an attempt to help reduce the spread of the virus, we would ask that you wear a face mask or shield to this event and that you do not arrive until your appointment time. We will also

require you to **sanitise your hands** on entry to the school and not to pick up any other child's work. I am sorry we have to put these procedures in place but it is essential we try and protect everyone in our small community.

Illness

Please can I ask that if your child(ren) is feeling unwell and they show any symptoms of Covid-19 you keep them at home and get a **PCR test**. They should not return to school until you have the result of that test. If it is negative they can return straight away, if they are feeling well enough. If it is positive, they will need to self -isolate for 10 days, in which case we would also ask that you please inform the office.

Winter/Change in the Weather

The weather is certainly changing quickly and when we return after half term, it will be essential your child(ren) wrap up warm when playing outside. Therefore, please can you ensure they have a named winter coat, scarf, gloves and hat, to keep them warm. We would also recommend wellies and waterproofs being brought into school, especially for Forest School, which they have once a week. We would also suggest that the children now wear navy/black jogging bottoms and top for PE. Our uniform policy, including PE kit requirements, can be found on our website under 'Policies'.

Phonics Screening

I would like to thank Miss Aktar and Mrs Robbins for the Phonics Information Evening and to the parents/ guardians who attended. Our children in Year 2 will be undertaking their formal screening next half term, and those in Year 1 will undertake their screening in the summer term. 

Message from our Deputy Headteacher

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Black History Month - October 2021

As a school, we are marking Black History Month with engaging activities and learning opportunities for the children in their lessons and in assemblies.





We were very pleased to welcome one of our parents, **Mrs Sylvester**, to talk to the children in Owls and Kites Classes about how her family in Grenada answered 'the call from the Mother land' to come and work in the UK to support the NHS. We learnt about the two-week journey that hundreds of people made to the UK on a boat named *The Empire Windrush*, as well as other boats, thereafter. Mrs Sylvester shared a series of fascinating photos of her ancestors and family members, some of whom worked for the London Underground, and the NHS as midwives and nurses.

In my **Values Assemblies** on Wednesday mornings, I have been focusing on the lives of some prominent people in black history. So far, we have learnt about **Rosa Parks** and **Harriet Tubman**. Although these have been difficult subjects to discuss, the children have amazed me with their outstanding attitudes to fairness, equality and kindness. We have recognised Rosa and Harriet's bravery and courage in such difficult circumstances.


Owls

Kites





Pupil contact will amount to 190 of the 195 days. Schools will be closed on five of the 195 days. These five days will enable teacher training to take place in accordance with Teachers' Conditions of Service. Training days set as follows: Wednesday 1 September - Friday 3 September 2021 (3 days), Friday 26 November 2021 (1 day) and Friday 22 July 2022 (1 day). Term 3 - 63 days = 195 days
